




## ADISADEL COLLEGE PLACES 3<sup>RD</sup> AT THE VODAFONE ICON HIGH SCHOOL EDITION



### SURPRISE VISIT TO PAA COLO

On October 17, 2015, the 1969 year group paid a memorable/historic visit to Mr R. T. Orleans-Pobee (Paa Colo). The 69ers ascended the Hill on September 17, 1944 as the first batch of students admitted to Adisadel College by Paa Colo personally on his appointment as Headmaster.

They, therefore, saw it as a duty to have visited earlier. They, however, told Colo that (1) The visit should be seen as a traditional knocking on behalf of all 69ers both home and abroad for a pending main visit.

(2) That the fact that Paa Colo was not informed earlier about the visit was to find out whether he still practiced what he taught us in school to be prepared at all times for impromptu visits. They therefore owed him no apology for keeping him in the dark about the visit.

(3) That the visit was to find out how he was faring and to wish him GOD'S continuous blessing and good health. They assured him of more frequent visits since as his 'Abakaan' (first borns), they had to be near him at all times.

In the year 2014, the 69ers presented two specially designed mugs of a complete list of the year group to Paa Colo to signify their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of their presence on the Hill.

The 69ers President BERNARD MONNEY led the following, on behalf of both locals and diasporans, for the visit: Treasurer DARYMPLE HAYFRON, Secretary AKWESI NTOW, RAM BHAVNANI, REUBENSON OFORI-KUMA, ROBERT KWETIEY QUAYNOR and Rev ROBERT NYANNI. It is worthy to note that this is the first year group to visit Paa Colo with one of their number as a Reverend Minister to pray for him. This is what 'Abakaans' (first borns) do.

### ENDOWMENT FUND

In 1993, the Board of the College and some Santaclausians namely Sq. Leader C. W. Stanley-Pierre, Mr. Edwin Richard Hayford, and Ebenezer Annan Brew Hayford formalized the Endowment Fund by signing a trust deed, dated 15 December, 1993. The Board was represented by its then chairman Sq. Ldr. C. W. Stanley Pierre, who also became the chairman of the Council of the Fund, together with the following as other members: Mr. E. R. Hayford, Rt. Rev. K.A. Quashie, Mr. E. B. Sekyi Hughes, Mr. Sam Jonah, Mr. Thomas Quansah, and Mr. E. A. B. Mayne (secretary) as its first council.

The Fund was endowed with an initial amount of ₵6,300,000 (GH₵ 630 presently). Upon the advice of Dr. S. Y. Bimpong-Buta in 2006, the fund was registered under the Companies Act, 1963 (Act 179) as a company limited by guarantee with three members only (Hera Bhavnani, Frank Addo and Dr. S. Y.
